Follow Up With Employers

A simple formula you can use in your exchange is:

- 1. Who are you
- 2. Why you are contacting them
- 3. What you are asking for (being specific helps them know if they can help)

Sample Text:

The Reality of Job Searching

- Job searching is hard expect rejection
- Be comfortable with uncertainty, control what you can
- These skills are useful forever
- Careers are Stepping Stones, not a Ladder





Quick Stats on Internships

- Just over 70% of employers end up offering their interns full-time jobs (National Association of Colleges & Employers)
- According to 34% of college graduates, doing an internship has significantly impacted career directions and employment opportunities
- (National Association of Colleges and Employers)
- Students who have done an internship are more likely to be employed and earn more in the first years after college



Why Internships Matter

- Gain industry knowledge
- Explore and refine your interests (industry, working style, etc.)
- Creates new interests
- Connects you to industry professionals
- Get paid to get experience
- Earn credit(s) to learn






Build Experience: From Exploring to Deepening Involvement

Build Experience: Key Attributes Employers Ask For

- Ability to work in a team
- Problem-solving skills
- Analytical/quantitative skills
- Communication skills (written and verbal)

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Activity: Reflect on one skill from the previous slide and identify a simple way you are already developing that skill now

Get Jobs & Internships: Where to Look

- Activate your <u>Handshake Account</u> (Handshake is curated and maintained for a student audience)
- Student Jobs
- Your network (word of mouth, email, LinkedIn)
- Other job boards (e.g. Indeed)



Get Jobs & Internships: Searching

- Start your search to obvious terms e.g. your major, job titles to survey what might interest you
- Add keywords that you know are interesting or important to you (e.g. software, tasks, job duties, concepts, industry words)
 - You might be surprised by the results that come back
- Keep an open mind, especially for your first internship/job



Get Jobs & Internships: Applying

- Follow the instructions on the job description
- Highlight experience and skills you have that align with the job qualifications
- Customize your cover letter (sometimes optional or not used)
- You don't need to meet every qualification to apply!



Get Jobs & Internships: Strategies for Keep At It

Q: "How many jobs should I apply for?"

A: "As many as it takes."

Job Searching is an endurance trial -- a marathon, break your run into stages:

- Set daily and/or weekly application goals.
 - Example: I'm going to set aside 30 minutes/week, or my goal is to submit 5 applications/week
- Prioritize your time
- It may be helpful to keep a tracking sheet to record your applications
- If you are "hitting a wall" step away and ask for help!
